General Information

Electronic punching - SI will be used **Toilets** - There will be Portaloos on site. **Maps** - Premarked maps, scale 1:10,000, printed waterproof paper. **Control Descriptions** - Printed on the map. Loose control descriptions will be available in -2 box at the Start. **Safety** - All competitors take part in this event at their own risk. The weather in November could be cold and wet so please dress accordingly. **Results** - These will be published on this website as soon as possible after the event.

Scottish Score Trophies - Please would the current trophy holders make sure that their trophy is engraved and ready to be presented to the new winner at the event. You can give them to the Organiser, Ian Doig, or Janet Clark (ESOC) any time from now on.

The Trophy Presentation for the winners of the **2015 SOL** will take place at this event
Those who have already received their trophy from the previous winner, or those who have retained their trophy from 2014 because they won their class again in 2015, are invited to bring their trophy to the event so that it can be presented in front of their fellow orienteers.

Directions:

FROM THE NORTH:- Head for the M90 at either Broxden or Friarton and go south to Junction 9 (Bridge of Earn). Head South on the A912 and after 3 km take the A913 East towards Newburgh. Continue for 1.5 km and turn Right on unclassified road for 2 km until you come to the Forest entrance on the left. This will be marked with a flag and event sign.

FROM THE SOUTH: Take the M90 until Junction 8 and follow the A91 through Gateside and continue past the first signpost for Strathmiglo on the right hand side until you come to an unclassified road 400m on the left hand side. This will be signposted for the event. The forest entrance will be 6 km along this road on the right hand side and will be marked with an event sign. Parking will be on Forest tracks

Safety and Risk

A comprehensive risk assessment will have been carried out by the organiser, but participants take part at their own risk and are responsible for their own safety during the event.

Additional Information:

The forest is popular with mountain bikers and care should be taken when using some of the paths within the forest area. Signs will be posted at the Forest entrance to warn the public that this event is taking place.

Some tracks and paths created by mountain bikers exist in addition to those shown on the map.

Please note that there are large piles of cut timber on the way to the start. These should be avoided and absolutely should not be climbed.

Some gorse is shown in green, some is still shown as rough open. Because of recent growth it has not been possible to remap every gorse patch and show as green. Not every gorse patch is mapped.

Crossing points are shown on the map. These are compulsory and competitors should not attempt to cross any fence towards and within the open ground. Fences and walls which should not be crossed except at crossing points are marked on the map with a solid purple line.

On courses A & B competitors may cross the unmarked fence north of control 123 to gain access to the field/forest.
