FIXTURES WORKING PARTY REPORT

Rab has passed on to me a summary of the above Report which has been compiled by some group of working party-type orienteers who probably write memos and reports for a living and get some curious kick out of doing the same in their spare time. On your behalf, dear members, they have been working-partying like nobody's business and have now come up with some key recommendations.

Seriously though, their findings do have implications for the sport, so here they are :-

- a shortened racing season from February to June, culminating in a new style championship event, provisionally called the British Orienteering Championships, for 4 competitive classes only, W & M 21+ and W & M 21-. The existing championships would continue as a separate event, provisionally called the National Orienteering Championships
- the replacement of the present structure of National and Badge Events by a structure of Area Championships, ranking Regional Events, and non-ranking Regional Events

Rab and I both have the full Report Summary, which is quite lengthy, but which members should feel free to ask for copies of.
